Chairman's Chatter

The Parish Councillors have been busy again supporting the Mawdesley community with a range of initiatives and projects for improvement to our village environment and facilities. As a Council we've always got the interests of the environment in mind. Whether it's looking out for the protection of the greenbelt and sustainability in our reviews of planning applications, the litter collection, or the various community projects we sponsor each year we're always mindful of the impact on nature and the wildlife habitat

On Moss Fields this winter, we're planting 420 trees and shrubs kindly donated by the Woodland Trust. We think this will offer a splash of all rear round colour and a generous habitat for the birds and bees. We're also following up on the popular suggestion of a community orchard and have bought twelve fruit trees to be planted on Moss Fields. For a small contribution these memorial trees are available to be adopted on a first come first served basis. Please contact the Parish Council for details. And there's more, thanks to the initiative of Steph Poole and Liz Handford we're planting a blossom circle as a peaceful place for all to enjoy.

Building and development in the village is again a concern evidenced by the number of residents who contact us about tree felling and planning applications. We were grateful to

Councillor Boardman for attending the November meeting to give us the benefit of his experience and insight as our Ward Councillor. Anyone can register their comments on planning applications or to apply for a tree protection order (TPO) via the Chorley Borough Council website. The more comments they receive the better their perspective on what's important to our village.

There are several sources of funding available to the village for infrastructure and community projects. Each year the Parish Council receive applications for capital projects and many organisations have benefited from a grant donation. There's also Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) funding from Chorley Borough Council. The Parish Council can use this money to improve the village infrastructure. If you have any good ideas about projects that would benefit the community, please ask Trish our new Parish Clerk for an application form. Cllr Boardman is encouraging the Parish Council to come up with projects which address community 'need'. Matched funding for such projects is potentially available from Chorley Borough Council and so we'd like to hear from the village about what would serve us now and into the future.

I have it on good authority that on 17th December Santa will be visiting Mawdesley to check in on us prior to the big day. He'll be taking a sleigh ride through the village from 5:30pm. Look out for him and give him an encouraging wave. Special thanks again go to the Silcock family for the donation of the Christmas tree. By the time you read this the lights will have been turned on to the accompaniment of The Red Admiral brass band and carol singers.

A Humble, Faithful and Dedicated Man

Following a request from the family of the late John Radford, David Reynolds, former Rector of the Parish of Mawdesley has written a few words regarding John (1945 – 2021)

A Humble, Faithful and Dedicated Man. I thought the folk of Mawdesley might want to learn of the recent passing of John Radford.

John was hugely respected in Mawdesley and contributed immensely to its life. Typical of John, he never wanted any acknowledgement or praise for the many things he did. In the early days here, he was involved in 'It's a Knockout', worked hard for the Millennium Green, and for many years was the licensee of the Village Hall. He also served on a number of local school Governing Bodies. His funeral and burial took place at St Peters. The church was packed.

A common theme among the tributes spoke of John's humility and his ability to be a peacemaker. That is something I can testify to. At a number of feisty meetings, we both attended John was always the calming spirit. For me he is epitomised in the words of the delightful hymn 'Dear Lord and Father of Mankind' which closes with the words, 'Speak through the earthquake, wind, and fire, O still, small voice of calm.'

John latterly was a faithful and dedicated churchwarden at St Peters and no doubt many will have met him when coming for weddings baptisms and funerals. His was the face of welcome and we greatly mourn his loss and his friendly smile. Of course, our thoughts and prayers at this time are with his wife Elizabeth and children Anne and Andrew and the wider family.

Primary School. It was so lovely to welcome everyone back (especially our new reception children) ready for the first term – a term full of new challenges, plenty of learning and of course, lots of fun!



Forest School started again, with the children full of enthusiasm about learning outside in our beautiful village. There was also much excitement as our new box of Forest School equipment arrived. We now have hammocks, palms drills, tarpaulin, various tools and whittling and carving equipment. The children have been investigating how to use these to the best effect when they have been doing Forest School activities. We are really lucky to have Burt's Moss and the Millennium Green so close to our school, as there's always something new to learn about there. The children have



been amazed by the different types of fungus there – none more so than 'Witches Finger!' They have also enjoyed den building and making fires in our firepit at school, where of course marshmallows had to be toasted!



Class 3 started their Archbishop of York Youth Trust Young Leader's Award in September where they learn by the motto 'Be the change you want to see'. Already we have seen great leadership skills taking place in various ways. There has been plenty of help given to the

young leaders' neighbours and families: taking bins out for neighbours, having a sort out of old toys and clothes and donating them to charity, cleaning family and friends' cars, cooking family meals and so the list goes on. This will lead to the children planning a community project to 'be the change they want to see in the community'.



As a whole school, the children have been thinking about the environment and the current COP26 Conference that has been taking place. After learning a bit more about it, the children have all made pledges, thinking about ways that they can help. We discussed that many little changes can help to bring about a bigger change.

The children's pledges are displayed at our school entrance – they are proud of their ideas, which range from making sure they turn the lights off when they leave a room, to encouraging parents to prepare at least one vegetarian meal a week.



Our Remembrance Service this year was very personal to our children, as they brought in photographs of family members who had served in the

wars. Our head boy and head girl read a poem, prayers were read by a class 2 member, and the youngest and the eldest pupils laid the wreath, which was very kindly donated by Bay Tree Flower Farm.

Guidelines for applying for a grant are:

- 1 The project must be capital for a tangible asset
- 2 The applicant should be a formal organisation or charity within the village.
- 3 The money needs to be spent within the financial year that it is budgeted for.
- 4 Three quotations are required
- 5 The applicant should be able to demonstrate that they have sought funding from other bodies, National Lottery, etc.
