Chairman's Chatter

A message from the Chairman at the Annual Meeting of the Council

Welcome everyone to the 2022 Annual Meeting of the Mawdesley Parish Council. Your parish council have been as busy as ever trying to encourage the flora and fauna to thrive in the village. Thanks to our lengthsman, Peter Boardman and his able assistant and fellow Councillor Mike Henty we've planted over 400 trees and shrubs, mainly on Moss Fields but also along some of the road verges. We've also planted hundreds of bulbs and so we very much hope this planting will benefit the future generations of our beautiful village.

We listened to the village, and you overwhelmingly told us that the theme for the Moss Fields should major on nature and conservation. The community orchard is now a reality with twelve fruit trees' rooted on Moss Fields. Bird boxes and a bug house have been installed, although I can't report that any of them are inhabited. Thanks to Steph Poole and Liz Hanford for coming up with the idea of a blossom circle and for making all the arrangements to complete the project. You will I hope agree we're already seeing the benefits from all the investment in the planting.

Every year the Parish Council invite community groups to apply for funding for capital projects. This year we approved the donation of $\mathfrak{L}600$ to the Cricket Club for a new field gate, $\mathfrak{L}2,500$ to the Millennium Green for new recycling bins, $\mathfrak{L}2,500$ to the Village Hall for modern stage lighting and $\mathfrak{L}400$ to Mawdesley Scouts for new equipment storage facilities — all of which help to enhance Mawdesley as a village community.

As we entered the council year, we were still reeling from the Covid lockdown rules and social distancing. The community came together to support each other as we strived to get back to our regular community calendar. The Parish Council were delighted to see a local family taking over and start to rejuvenate the last remaining pub in the village. The Red Lion has received a much needed injection of love and commitment and the pub is once again alive with villagers engaging in a plethora of innovative events and social gatherings.

There has been a groundswell of support to restarting the very colourful Mawdesley Tea Party and other popular events. Creativity and community spirit in the village is always well supported by the Mawdesley Parish Council. I'm sure these extremely important social initiatives will help us not only recover from Covid but grow from strength to strength.

As every year we've endeavoured to address antisocial issues, such as dog fouling, speeding, and littering. We've supported the concerns of the village by engaging with the police, Lancashire County council and Chorley borough council.

We've also continued to maintain and upgrade the village footpaths and plan to provide further investment in the coming years. We also hope to see the realisation of a new bridle way between Mawdesley and Croston. I'm hopeful that Chorley Borough Council will follow up on their commitment to get this done.

Sadly, this is my last meeting as a member of the Parish council. After 10 years of service, I decided not to restand for re-election in the recent May elections. I joined the Parish Council when my wife Lesley and I moved to Mawdesley with our young children as a way to get to know the village and meet new friends. It's been a fantastic time and I've thoroughly enjoyed working with the other councillors on the variety of projects we've engaged in. Whether it be, buying a field with the generous Bert Moss legacy and transforming it into a community asset or the village clean up days, the sense of community and friendship has always been present. Who knew filling a big skip with other people's rubbish could be such fun!

Finally, I'd like to give a sincere thank you to my fellow councillors past and present and to Trish and Peter for helping me make the last year another successful one for Mawdesley and the Parish Council.

'Hello' from Small school, BIG opportunities SS Peter & Paul's School

Greetings from SS Peter & Paul's! It seems like time has flown by since we last updated you on what has been taking place in school but rest assured we have been as busy as ever!



Like everyone, we have been deeply affected by the situation in Ukraine. In order to support the aid effort we held a 'Blue and Yellow' day when children and staff could come to school wearing anything blue and yellow to mirror the colours on the Ukrainian flag. We asked for voluntary donations and raised an amazing £350 on the day and this was sent to the Red Cross appeal. We also supported a Charity collection in Liverpool and our families donated a super amount of things such as bandages, towels, toiletries, gloves, scarves, socks and many more items for which the appeal organisers were very grateful.

Children in Class 3 are looking forward to their first residential trip in over 2 years. Staff and children will be leaving school on Monday 16th May for a few days of adventurous activities at a local PGL centre. The children are looking forward to activities such as Jacob's Ladder, Buggy Building, the Trapeze and Orienteering not to mention a couple of late nights! We wish the children and staff lots of fun and a safe and happy trip.



The next main event in school that the children and staff are looking forward to celebrating is the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. We will be celebrating with a Street Party, Design a Crown competition and other fun activities. In preparation for the celebration we have been looking at the Queen's reign over the last 70 years and have studied decades of time to find out what major events occurred and what was popular in Music, Technology and a variety of other areas. Our school hall is decorated with bunting, historical information posters and 2 super mosaics, which children in Class 2 and Class 3 have made, of the Queen in 1952 and 2022. Class 1 have constructed a super 3D model of the Coronation Crown and this is also displayed in the hall. Children in Y5 and Y6 have helped to plan the party food menu and linked this into the use of spreadsheets in their Computing lessons. All we need now is some sunshine on the day of our celebration and we will all be happy.







Our weekly Stay and Play sessions continue throughout the school term. They take place on a Wednesday afternoon between 1.15pm and 3.00pm. The sessions are a great opportunity to bring children to school to meet others and play in a fun environment. There is no charge for the sessions and water and fruit are provided as refreshments. JOIN MAWDESLEY WOMEN'S INSTITUTE


For over 100 years the WI has given women a voice and prides itself on being an organisation which is a trusted place for women of all generations to share experiences and learn from each other.
