



The new year and decade are upon us and, in the wake of storms Ciara and Dennis, it looks like we're in for another roaring twenties albeit for very different reasons.

Certainly, the coming new year is not without its challenges. You should all have heard about the Central Lancashire Local Plan and the call for potential housing sites. The proposed sites in Mawdesley are all located on the eastern side of New Street between the Goodvear development and Tarnbeck. It important to recognise that these are only proposed sites and no applications for development have been made at present. You were given the opportunity to respond and acting on advice, the Parish Council has responded. Whilst we have accepted limited housing development in this area, we felt that provision should also be made for both community and business use. The central area in particular we felt could be used for additional car parking and perhaps a doctors' surgery, pharmacy and other retail outlets. The area could also include local recycling facilities such as bottle banks. A full transcript of our response to these proposals has been put on the parish notice boards.

In 2012 the structure of development planning changed. Whilst county councils are required to develop Local Plans, parish councils like Mawdesley can develop their own Neighbourhood Plan. Earlier regulations meant that Neighbourhood plans had little effect on planning decisions and we were of the opinion that devising a plan may not be effective in controlling development. However, following discussions with the local authority we now have a greater understanding of its importance and will be applying to the to start the process. You be hearing more about this in the coming months.

Work is continuing to develop access to Moss Fields. The gate on the Short Butts path from the Millennium Green to Smithy Lane is now open and the sign is installed. A change of use planning application has been submitted



and, once accepted, we can start the serious work of laying good quality footpaths.

Planning issues aside, life goes on in the village and there are a few things to look forward to.

We are hoping to arrange the Mawdesley Clean-Up day for Saturday 2nd May and the large skip will be at the Village Hall during the morning. If you need the pick-up truck to collect unwieldy items it will be available on a first come first served basis - please let the Parish Clerk know well in advance.

This year marks the 20th anniversary of the opening of the Millennium Green. There will be a celebration on 13th June from 14:00 to 17:00 with an evening disco in the Village Hall. The day time event will include fairground rides and competitions for children. The Red Admiral Band will also be performing.

The very popular Scarecrow Festival will be held on the weekend on the 4th/5th July, so get your thinking caps on. The entries last year were superb and I'm sure this year's will be even better.

And finally, there are some very talented individuals and groups within the village. Last year Mawdesley Amateur Dramatics staged two productions in the Village Hall and received no less than 8 NODA award nominations. Chris Hill won best supporting actor for his performance in "Witness for the Prosecution" and Emma Meen won her award for the best original script for "Once upon a Pantomime". I saw both performances and they were fantastic. Whatever you do be sure to see MAD's next play "The Reunion" running from 18th to 20th June.

Happy Easter

In 325 CE, the Council of Nicaea established that Easter would be held on the first Sunday after the first Full Moon occurring on or after the vernal equinox. (*) From that point forward, the Easter date depended on the ecclesiastical approximation of March 21 for the vernal equinox.

Easter, also called Pascha (Greek, Latin) or Resurrection Sunday, is a festival and holiday commemorating the resurrection of Jesus from the dead, described in the New Testament as having occurred on the third day after his burial following his crucifixion by the Romans at Calvary c. 30 AD.

The term Easter gets its name from Eastre, the Anglo-Saxon goddess who symbolizes the hare and the egg.

INRI stems from the Latin phrase 'lesus Nazarenus Rex Iudaeorum' meaning 'Jesus of Nazareth, King of the Jews'. This was the notice Pontius Pilate nailed over Jesus as he lay dying on the cross.

Easter Lilies- The white blossoms symbolize the purity of Jesus. Lilies, emerging from the earth in the spring, also symbolize new life and the resurrection of Christ. All about Easter Lilies. The lamb - Represents Jesus, "the Lamb of God". The cross - Symbolizes Jesus' victory over death.

The extensive adoption of the cross as Christian iconographic symbol arose from the 4th century.

The Easter Bunny (also called the Easter Rabbit or Easter Hare) is a folkloric figure and symbol of Easter, depicted as a rabbit bringing Easter eggs.

This custom of the Easter egg can be traced to early Christians of Mesopotamia, and from there it spread into Russia and Siberia through the Orthodox Churches, and later into Europe through the Catholic and Protestant Churches.


The tallest Easter egg chocolate was made in Italy in 2011.

The art of painting eggs is called pysanka, which originated in Ukraine. It involves using wax and dyes to colour the egg.

The Hot Cross bun marks the end of Lent and different parts of the hot cross bun have a certain meaning, including the cross representing the crucifixion of Jesus, and the spices inside signifying the spices used to embalm him at his burial. They are now available all year round in some places



Mawdesley Village Hall is to undergo a £32,000 makeover after being awarded grants by the National Lottery Fund and the Parish Council.

The work will be carried out by local heating and plumbing engineers Sylvesters and will include refurbishment of the men's and women's toilets, the disabled toilet and baby changing facilities.

Funding has come in the form grants of £5,000 from the Parish Council and crucially, a £10,000 Awards for All grant from the National Lottery. The remainder of the money is from funds raised by the Village Hall over recent years.

The venue is so popular that the only time work could be scheduled is in August during the summer holidays. If you are planning a party or event this Autumn or Winter remember to book early as the venue will be even more in demand. 


Mawdesley Village Hall Big Screen Film Night

Red Admiral Music Academy

It has been an exceptionally busy start to the year for everyone at Red Admiral Music Academy. Our main contesting band, Red Admiral Brass had their first competition, Brass in the Wire, at Parr Hall in Warrington at the end of January. They are now working on their final preparations for the Regional Brass Band Championships which take place at Blackpool Winter Gardens on 23rd February. This is the most important competition on the brass band calendar with over 70 bands from across the North West competing for places at the National Finals which take place later in the year.

Our Youth Band took part in the Halifax Youth Brass Festival in the fabulous setting of Halifax Minster on the 8th February. This was a non-competitive event where 5 Youth Brass Bands from across the North of England put on an afternoon of music. Red Admiral Youth put on a fabulous performance with an animal themed programme which they had been working on since Christmas and the event culminated with a massed band performance which involved 150 youngsters joining forces on stage to play together.

On 15th February we hosted an event at Chorley Town Hall which involved 5 bands from the different brass band sections (think football leagues) performing this year's pieces for the Regional Brass Band Championships. Red Admiral Youth opened the evening with a repeat of their animal themed programme, performing to a packed venue with an audience of over 300 people. Red Admiral Brass played as the 4th Section Band and we were joined by Lostock Hall Memorial Band (3rd section), Old Hall Brass (2nd section), Blackburn & Darwen Band (1st section) and Elland Silver Band who came over from Yorkshire to represent the Championship Section.

St Peter's C of E Primary School

Little Acorns Pre-school has come of age, we are now 21 years young and what better way to celebrate than with the key to our very own door?!

At the end of December 2019, Daniel Ballard the Headteacher of Mawdesley St Peter's School, Hurst Green, completed his long-term, visionary project by creating a stunning new Pre-school Unit within the gardens of the school. "The foundations of education

Moving Little Acorns over the Christmas break was a gargantuan task and very much a community effort, with parents, friends and members of the Management Committee all chipping in to ensure the Pre-school was up and running for the new term in January. The finished product is a testament to the kindness and effort of so many families and individuals within this amazing village.

Pre-school Manager, Marion Connett has been with Little Acorns for over 17 years and graduated with a BA Ed. Hons during her employment, "When I was interviewed for the post, the pre-school was in its infancy and operated for just a few afternoons a week, so it fitted perfectly around my University studies. It's funny to think about it now but back then we borrowed a classroom within the school and had to pack everything away at the end of each session. Fast-forward to 2020 and what a difference, our own purpose-built Pre-school!".

The Early Years landscape changed vastly over the intervening years and the Pre-school kept apace, with staff gaining professional qualifications and responding to the latest research in child development. With consistently good Ofsted inspection results, a 'Step into Quality' award and County Council 'Lead Practitioner' status, Little Acorns increased in size and stature, opening every weekday and working in partnership with another provider and Mawdesley St Peter's School to provide flexible sessions, including a full day care option.

The staff team are thrilled with the new premises, "Having our own dedicated space is such a wonderful opportunity and in terms of the children's learning, the possibilities are now endless! Inside we've created a very special haven, packed with interesting play spaces and natural materials to stimulate the children's imagination and encourage a deeper level of engaged play because we know that's when the very highest level of learning can take place. Outside, in our 'welly zone' the children have their own secure space, surrounded by trees, nature and wildlife, offering an array of sensory opportunities and challenges to encourage problem solving."

Marion and her team hold a shared ethos for Little Acorns based on child-led learning and as a Manager she is very much 'hands on', "I absolutely love my job, it's like nothing I've done before, every day is different and spontaneity is key, so it's always fresh and fun. Working with children at this age is a joy and the progress they make cognitively and emotionally over their pre-school life is phenomenal to observe. We are a happy little family without a doubt. It's been fascinating and an incredible privilege to see the children take ownership of their new environment and the future is looking bright for Little Acorns with lots of fun activities in the pipeline, including children's yoga sessions to promote wellbeing and mindfulness and regular cooking activities to develop practical skills and interests. I firmly believe that every child should have the chance to access a high-quality pre-school experience, one which nurtures their independence, builds their self-confidence, values social interaction and fosters resilience. Developing these positive dispositions and attitudes helps prepare children for life in the wider world and as a result our children have impressively smooth school transitions – I've seen many Little Acorns actually skipping into school on their first day!".





Little Acorns Pre-school is a not-for-profit organisation with charitable status and welcomes children aged 3 to 5 years. We are also eligible providers for the 30 hours funded childcare scheme. 
